NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION

BLOCK 27 COLLECTOR ROADS MUNICIPAL CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

THE STUDY

The City of Vaughan, as co-proponents with the Block 27 Landowners Group Inc., has completed a "Schedule C" Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) for the development of the Block 27 collector roads network. Please refer to the map for the location of the Block 27 collector road MCEA study area.

Following consultation with the public, key stakeholders, Indigenous Communities, and other external agencies, the recommended collector road network within Block 27 was identified. The collector roads will accommodate two to four lanes of traffic and include active transportation facilities on both sides of the road.

ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY REPORT REVIEW PERIOD

This study was completed in accordance with the planning and design process for "Schedule C" projects, as outlined in the *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment* (Municipal Engineers Association, October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011, 2015 and 2023) under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*.

An Environmental Study Report (ESR) has been prepared to document the study process, existing conditions, identification and evaluation of alternative road alignments and cross-sections, the recommended plan, potential environmental impacts and recommended mitigation measures, and the engagement activities undertaken as part of this study. The ESR is being made available for a 30-day review period from **October 29, 2024** to **November 29, 2024**.
