

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO REPEAL DESIGNATION BY-LAW UNDER SECTION 32 OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT</b></p>
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**Re: Notice of application to repeal Designation By-law [139-2024](#) pursuant to Part IV, Section 32 of the *Ontario Heritage Act* regarding [7230 Nashville Road](#).**

Please take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Vaughan is in receipt of an application pursuant to Section 32(1) of the *Ontario Heritage Act* to repeal By-law 139-2024 designating the property municipally known as [7230 Nashville Road](#) in the City of Vaughan, in the Province of Ontario, as a property of cultural heritage value or interest.

The James Dalziel House, located at 7230 Nashville Road, in the City of Vaughan was built some time between 1850-1860. It is of Georgian architectural style, with red brick and a hipped roof. The front elevation facing, facing Nashville Road, has a centrally placed portico and door and it is painted white.

The Dalziel family was a prominent settler family in Vaughan. Initially from Scotland, John Dalziel, and Ann Bell and 8 of their children sought to make a new home and life for themselves. James Dalziel's niece Mary, and her husband Frank McCluskie donated land for the Presbyterian church in Nashville. Opening in 1902, the twins of Mary and Frank were the first to be baptized in the church. The subject property is a visual reminder of the farming economy of the 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries and remains surrounded by agricultural fields and other rural residential properties. The hard work and contributions of the Dalziel family in Vaughan is reflected.
